





Upright: *Courage, Confidence, Virility, Focus, Compassion, Valor*

In the upright position, the Strength card reveals mastery over one's raw emotions and urges, suggesting they've been directed constructively. This card places emphasis on the virtues of patience, discipline, and maintaining a balanced spirit, suggesting that true might isn't about physical prowess, but about emotional and spiritual tenacity. The Strength card also champions compassion and gentleness, prompting one to handle situations with calm rather than react impulsively or aggressively. It serves as a testament that genuine power stems from understanding and balance, not force or domination.

In matters of the heart, it indicates a relationship grounded in mutual respect and genuine connection. If health concerns are present, this card signifies a robust inner spirit and the capacity to recover and heal. Professionally, it hints at dedication and unwavering commitment to one's goals. At its core, the Strength card symbolizes the inner fortitude and courage required to navigate life's challenges with grace.

Reversed: *Stubbornness, Weakness, Aggression, Insecurity, Indulgence*

A reversed Strength highlights a potential inner struggle or wavering self-discipline. This might manifest as being consumed by personal insecurities, uncertainties, or apprehensions. Such a position suggests unchecked emotions or instincts, which can spur hasty or impulsive choices. You might find yourself battling intense emotions such as anger or frustration, or perhaps suppressing these emotions, risking future internal chaos or unexpected emotional eruptions.

In relational contexts, this reversed card might hint at power imbalances or a dynamic where one individual feels overshadowed or undervalued by the other. When considering health, it could emphasize neglected vulnerabilities or areas of weakness. Professionally, it might indicate hesitancy in decision-making or feeling overwhelmed by occupational hurdles.



The Strength card commonly depicts a gentle figure grasping the mouth of a lion, either riding it or standing beside it. This lion serves as a representation of untamed passions, raw instincts, and intense desires.

The figure's head is adorned with an infinity symbol, which symbolizes boundless strength, empowerment, and the timeless nature of existence. They are often crowned with a lemniscate or garlanded with flowers, both of which represent spiritual purity and the unending cycle of life.

In the background, imposing mountains are frequently featured as a reminder of life's challenges, tests, and obstacles. They highlight that genuine strength arises from confronting and surmounting these adversities. Overhead, a radiant golden light envelops the figure and the lion, implying a spiritual awakening, profound insight, and divine protection that encircles those who act with genuine courage and moral conviction.
