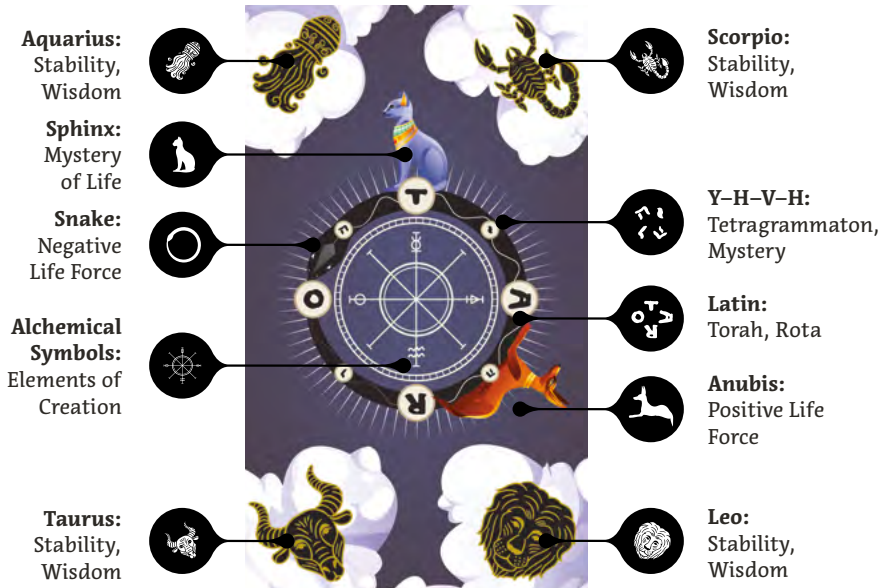

This can result in setbacks, delays, or unwanted changes. However, it is essential to recognize that this is just a temporary phase and the wheel will eventually turn again.

Additionally, the reversed Wheel of Fortune may suggest feeling stuck in a cycle or pattern, resulting in stagnant energy due to resistance to change or an inability to adapt. It is a reminder to reevaluate one's approach and become more proactive or even change direction.

Moreover, the reversed card serves as a warning against complacency and taking things for granted, emphasizing the importance of staying grounded and being prepared for potential challenges. 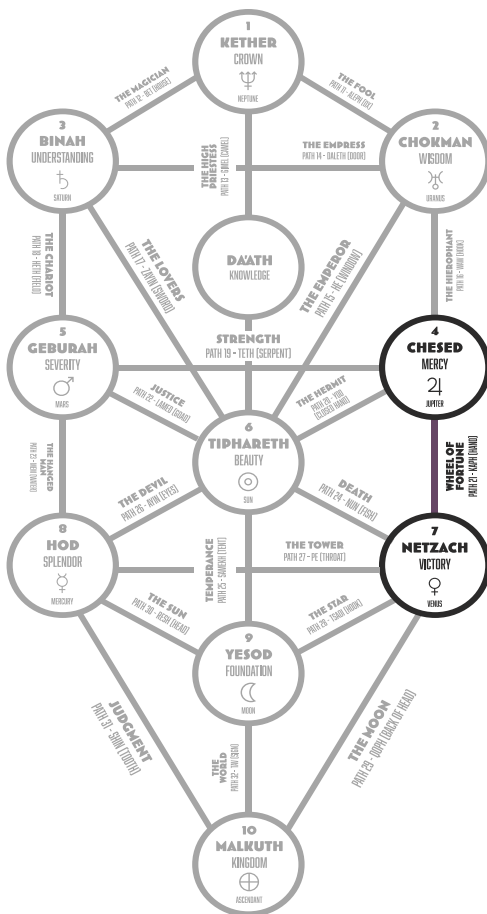

The Wheel of Fortune is a potent card in the Tarot deck, symbolizing cycles, destiny, and pivotal changes. As its name suggests, the card signifies the ever-turning wheel of life, representing the ups and downs, successes and failures, and the various turns of fortune one can encounter. It reminds us of the cyclical nature of life and the inevitability of change, urging acceptance of our position on the wheel, whether at a high or low point.

Visually, the card usually features a large, rotating wheel, often with the letters T, A, R, and O inscribed upon it or the symbols for alchemical elements. Around or within the wheel, different creatures or figures are typically depicted, each associated with different zodiac signs or representing different aspects of life. These figures might include a sphinx, an eagle, a lion, and a bull. The presence of these beings reminds the viewer of the broader universe's cosmic influence and the interconnectedness of various elements in one's life.

The Wheel of Fortune symbolizes the ebb and flow of circumstances, indicating that events are set in motion and change is inevitable, regardless of our expectations. Although the card can suggest luck or a positive turn of events, its primary message is the impermanence of all things and the natural rhythm of life's ever-changing circumstances.
