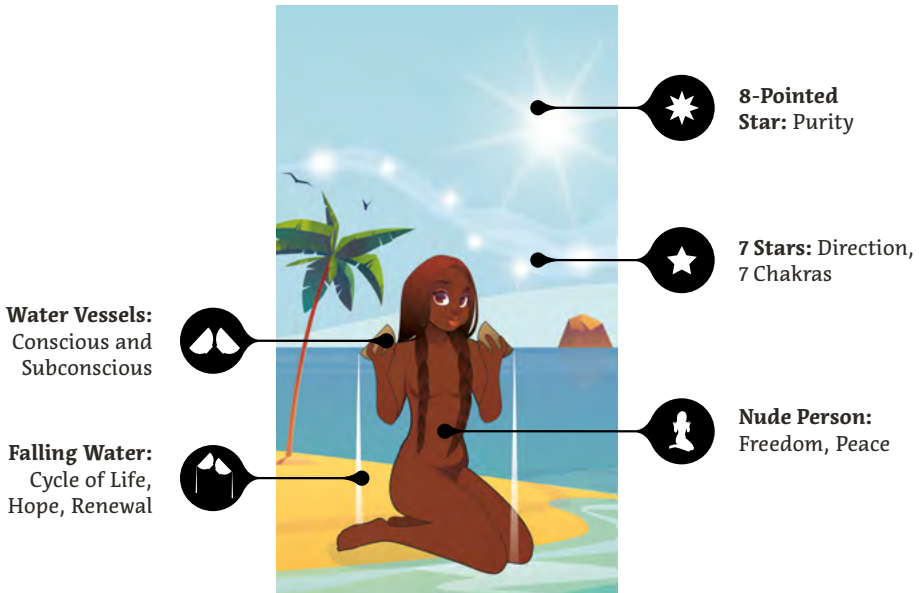

**Upright: Good Health, Inspiration, Renewal, Faith, Serenity, Opportunity, Hope**

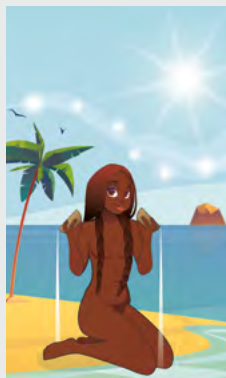
When this card appears upright in a reading, it is regarded as a positive sign, indicating an upcoming period of healing and tranquility. It promises that despite past darkness, a new dawn is on the horizon, bringing inspiration, optimism, and rejuvenation. This is a time to have faith in the universe and anticipate the goodness that lies ahead.

During this phase, one may experience deep intuition and inner clarity, where their spiritual guidance and inner voice can guide them to the right path. Just like the figure pouring water, this card suggests a harmonious giving and receiving, a flow of emotional and spiritual sustenance. The act of pouring water also symbolizes generosity, indicating a time when you may be called to give selflessly or receive kindness from others.

**Reversed: Despair, Hopelessness, Disappointment, Illness, Disconnection**

You could be going through a phase where things are not going according to plan and there is a struggle to have faith in a higher power or the universe. This can cause uncertainty or feelings of spiritual isolation, as previously solid spiritual beliefs might now be in flux. The reversed Star suggests that this innate wisdom is being ignored or mistrusted, potentially leading you away from your intended path.

In addition, there might be an excessive focus on personal challenges, hindering your ability to see the bigger picture or the external resources that could be available to you. This pessimistic outlook could become a self-fulfilling prophecy if negative anticipations are continually harbored and acted upon. The reversed Star can impede the rejuvenation and smooth transitions represented by the upright Star, indicating obstacles in overcoming past wounds or adversities.

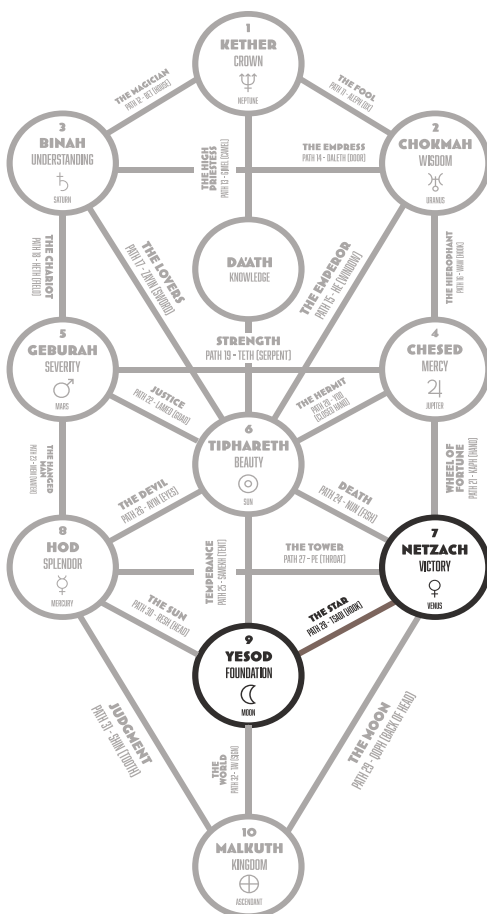

The Star card features a bare figure kneeling gracefully by a peaceful water body, with one foot touching the water to symbolize intuition and the psyche, and the other grounded on solid land to represent reality and the physical world. The figure holds two containers from which water flows seamlessly into the land and water below, depicting the harmonious relationship between dreams and tangible existence, and exemplifying healing, rejuvenation, and life's perpetual rhythm.

Above the figure is an expanse of sky adorned with numerous stars, with one eight-pointed star shining brilliantly in the center, surrounded by seven more modest stars that may allude to the seven Chakras or the seven celestial bodies in astrology. These steadfast stars represent hope, aspirations, and guidance from the heavens.

Although other elements like birds and trees may appear in the background, the starry sky remains the card's primary focus, evoking a serene atmosphere and inspiring feelings of renewal, tranquility, and limitless potential.



**ZODIAC:** Aquarius (January 20 – February 18) is an Earth sign ruled by Saturn. Capricorns are known for their grounded, pragmatic approach, and are often focused on tangible outcomes.



**PLANET:** Uranus is associated with sudden change, rebellion, and revolution. Uranus symbolizes the concept of enlightenment, where a flash of insight disrupts previously held beliefs.



**ELEMENT:** Air represents logic, intellect, and communication. The intangible element is considered to be active, masculine energy. It is associated with Spring, the Suit of Wands, and the East cardinal direction.
