

Below the moon lies a tranquil pool that reflects its light, representing the depths of our subconscious mind. A crayfish emerges from these waters, representing the surfacing of primal emotions and instincts that we often ignore. Acknowledging these hidden aspects of our psyche can offer invaluable insights into our true selves.

While we may encounter unforeseen challenges and illusions, The Moon card reminds us that tuning into our emotional and intuitive faculties can help us navigate these complexities with heightened awareness and discernment.

Reversed: *Misinterpretation, Uncertainty, Fear, Repressed Emotion, Mysteries*

This typically heralds a period of enlightenment, signifying a departure from confusion, delusions, or misunderstandings. It indicates that the fog of uncertainty is lifting, revealing clearer insights and truths. The shadows and misconceptions that clouded judgment during the Moon's upright position are beginning to fade, making way for enhanced comprehension and illumination.

Yet, this card in its reversed form can also point to a reluctance to trust one's intuition or a failure to address internal fears and doubts. It might highlight a pattern of disregarding intuitive insights, dreams, or emotional realities. Such evasion could stem from an unwillingness to confront harsh truths or from profound insecurities that undermine self-belief. It could suggest that there is a tendency to overlook or suppress psychic messages, dreams, or emotional truths.



The Moon evokes a world of mystery, illusion, and the subconscious. Dominating the card is a large, pale moon, often featuring a face, casting a silvery, dim light over the scene below. This celestial body symbolizes emotions, instincts, and the ever-shifting realm of dreams and intuition.

Nestled below is a serene body of water, either a tranquil pond or a flowing stream, reflecting the moon's glow. A crayfish or lobster emerges from this water, representing primal instincts and emotions surfacing from the depths of our unconscious. On either side of a serpentine path departing from the water, two canines raise their voices in a howl. They serve as symbols of our untamed nature, primal fears, and the raw, instinctual side of humanity, which often reacts to the intangible pull of the moon.

The path, representing life's journey, winds towards the horizon, leading the viewer's eyes towards two distant towers and a range of mountains. These towers stand as gateways or barriers between known and unknown realms, while the mountains signify challenges or higher understanding. This card, with its dreamlike landscape, calls on us to delve deep into the realms of our psyche, confront illusions, and trust our intuition amidst life's uncertainties.



ZODIAC: Pisces (February 19 – March 20) is a Water sign ruled by Neptune. Pisceans are known for their emotional depth and keen intuition.



PLANET: Neptune governs the realm of dreams, fantasies, and illusions. It blurs the lines between reality and the ethereal, making it hard to distinguish between what's tangible and what's imagined.



ELEMENT: Water rules emotions and is a symbol of healing, peace, dreams, and compassion. It is associated with Winter, the Suit of Cups, and the West cardinal direction.
