

Additionally, a hand emerging from a cloud holding the cup serves as a gift or offering from the divine. This heavenly nudge encourages individuals to embrace the available emotional and spiritual wealth. Furthermore, the water body depicted below, whether a river or a pond, mirrors the vastness of emotions and the subconscious. The lotuses or water lilies surrounding the cup suggest spiritual enlightenment and emotional purity.
