

Taking a step back, reflecting, and seeking a balanced approach to emotions can help steer the ship back in the right direction and bring a sense of stability and peace.

Upright Interpretations

Depicted as a knight riding a white horse, the Knight of Cups is often viewed as the most romantic of the court cards. While the knight's armor serves as protection, it's lighter than other knights', suggesting a balance between guardedness and openness. Unlike the Knight of Swords' steed, the horse moves gracefully, reflecting a calm approach.

Holding a single cup, the knight signifies emotional offerings or messages. The cup is often ornate, showcasing the depth and beauty of emotional experience and the arts. The background typically includes flowing streams or a calm river, reinforcing the theme of emotions and intuition. The knight's helmet or heels might have wings decorated on them, symbolizing their connection with the fluid and dreamy realm of emotions and imagination.

The card's overall feeling is dreaminess, creativity, and romance. The Knight of Cups leads with their heart instead of their head, navigating the world with intuition, empathy, and emotional understanding.



ZODIAC: Pisces (February 19 – March 20) is a Water sign ruled by Neptune. Pisceans are known for their emotional depth and keen intuition.



Scorpio (October 23 – November 21) is a Water sign ruled by Pluto. Scorpions are known for their intensity and depth.
