

In many decks, the King is set against a backdrop of mountains, suggesting challenges they have overcome and their elevated perspective and clarity of vision.

The King of Swords often wears armor beneath their robe, indicating their readiness for any intellectual battle or challenge. Their attire, often blue or in cool tones, aligns them with the element of air, further emphasizing their intellectual and communicative prowess.
