Upright: Conflict, Imbalance, Competition, Tension, Rivalry, Disagreement

The upright Five of Wands represents a time of competition, tension, and conflict. Although the Five of Wands portrays strife, it reminds us that conflict is a vital aspect of progress and development. By approaching these struggles constructively and considering them as opportunities to improve one's skills or beliefs, individuals can emerge stronger and more capable of dealing with future challenges. The crucial factor is to approach disagreements with an open mind, seeking to understand the opposing view, rather than merely striving for victory. This approach ensures that any solutions derived are beneficial to all parties involved.

Reversed: Avoid Conflict, Resolution, Tension Release, Respecting Differences

The Five of Wands in reverse signals a shift away from previously prevailing conflicts, tensions, and misunderstandings. Its presence may indicate a more harmonious atmosphere where disputes and disagreements are starting to be resolved. The card may also suggest a period of calm after the storm, with issues now confronted and settled, paving the way for improved communication and mutual understanding.

However, it is vital to remain alert to the possibility of repressed conflicts. Although everything may appear peaceful on the surface, unresolved issues could be brewing beneath, waiting to resurface. Avoidance or ignoring problems is not an effective solution. It is crucial to ensure that any disagreements are genuinely resolved and that the root causes are adequately addressed to prevent future discord.

Upright Interpretations

General Reading: You're facing challenges or disagreements. These can be internal or external, and while they may seem chaotic, they often serve to bring underlying issues to the surface.

Love Reading: Couples may find themselves bickering over minor issues. For those looking for love, it might represent competition or the feeling that you're clashing with potential partners.

Health Reading: Stress might be taking a toll, or there might be competing ideas about the right course for treatment. It can also indicate internal struggles with lifestyle choices.

Career Reading: In a career context, expect challenges or competition. This might manifest as team disagreements, competing for a position, or differing views on a project's direction. While it can be frustrating, navigating this conflict can lead to greater clarity.

Reversed Interpretations

The heart of the card commonly shows five people each grasping a wand, embroiled in what appears to be an uncontrolled and unsynchronized battle. The central image encapsulates the essence of the struggle that arises from clashing concepts, personalities, or aspirations.

The backdrop of the card may differ depending on the deck, but it usually emphasizes the unpredictability and chaos of the situation. For example, some depictions may show a sky full of storm clouds, underscoring the idea of an external environment that is as turbulent as the internal struggle. The uneven ground upon which the figures stand indicates the unstable foundation or basis of the disagreement, pointing towards misunderstandings or a lack of clear communication as potential root causes.

The wands themselves are a crucial symbol in this card. The disorganized positioning of the wands in the card suggests that these energies are currently misdirected or not being used cohesively. It is a call for alignment, collaboration, and finding common ground amidst apparent chaos to harness the true power of these wands.



ZODIAC: Aries (March 21 – April 19) is a Fire sign ruled by Mars. This sign embodies a determined, impulsive, and resolute energy.
